CDVSA surveyed 475 local, rural, and tribal law enforcement/ government agencies asking specific questions into the increase, decrease, or no change regarding domestic violence and sexual assault related calls. This survey is a very brief and small look into their experiences.

Who responded to the survey?


21 Local Law Enforcement Agencies such as municipal and borough police.

17 Other Government Agencies such as small cities and villages.


17 Tribal Law Enforcement Agencies including Village Public Safety Officers and tribal police.

What regions, did they respond from?

What did some agencies have to say?

"Dispatch requesting more assessment questions prior to officer/EMS arrival (anyone sick in residence, fevers, coughs, etc...) upon arrival masks – 6' distancing when necessary."

"Increased use of the crisis response line, increased visibility via virtual meetings, high use of PPE, increased calls to the advocates."
