In 1998 Sheriff Ron Cramer hired Captain Bresina as a Sergeant in the Eau Claire County Jail. In 2002 he was promoted to Jail Captain and served on many county committees such as Drug Court Team Member, Day Report Center, and the Eau Claire County Justice Center Building Project Committees. In 2010 he was appointed as Undersheriff and assumed the duties as Field Services Captain with responsibilities for the Patrol, Detective, and West Central Drug Task Force. He continues to serve on many committees including mental health services and local and state committees for Evidence Based Decision Making in our justice system. Captain Bresina has a degree in Police Science and is a graduate of the FBI National Academy in Quantico Virginia. Captain Bresina is committed to serving the residents of Eau Claire County with a commitment of maintaining professional, ethical and sound law enforcement services to the community.

Greg Frost, President of the Civil Citation Network and retired Admin Bureau Director with the Tallahassee (FL) Police Department.
