Alaska Issued its Second Successful AMBER Alert

(ANCHORAGE, Alaska) – Today, the Anchorage Police Department initiated Alaska’s second AMBER Alert. The AMBER Alert program considers the activation of the alert a success as the missing girl was located unharmed by police about an hour after the alert was launched.

The first AMBER Alert was issued earlier this year, on the 28th of February, by the Anchorage Police Department. That case turned out to be a staged abduction.

The Alaska AMBER Alert program came online in 2003. The program is a collaborative effort between law enforcement, local broadcasters and the public designed to safely recover abducted children.
