HISTORY OF EVENT

Shortly after Alaska became a state in 1959, Inspector Joe Vachon, commanding officer of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, wanted to find a way for the Mounties and Alaska State Troopers to get to know each other better on a personal as well as a professional basis and to strengthen their working partnership. Calvin "Cal" Miller, owner of a hotel in Whitehorse and friend of the RCMPs agreed to be the first sponsor. In 1960, the first competition, known as "The Shoot," was held. It is the longest standing international shooting competition in the world.
