Thanksgiving CIOT Stats

(ANCHORAGE, Alaska) – Alaska State Troopers concluded its Click It or Ticket effort to keep the roads safe during the Thanksgiving festivities. The effort started Nov. 26 and ended on Nov. 30.

For period 11/26/2014 thru 11/30/2014:

- 7 misdemeanor DUI arrests, 0 felony DUI Arrests
- 10 drivers charged with driving with a suspended or revoked license.
- 78 REDDIs reported with 6 drivers contacted and ultimately determined not to be DUI
- 35 damage only crashes 7 injury crashes and 2 fatal collision were investigated by troopers
- Of the 310 citations issued, 111 were issued for speeding and 22 issued for seatbelt or other occupant restraint violations

During the Thanksgiving enforcement campaign, troopers responded to a number of serious crashes, to include two fatality wrecks. With winter driving conditions here to stay, the Alaska State Troopers urge everyone to slow down, allow more time for all travel, and keep a greater following distance.

“Our goal is to help everyone get to their destination safely and enjoy time spent with family and friends,” said Lt. Dave Hanson, with the Alaska Bureau of Highway Patrol. “Remember, no holiday party or sales event is worth the risk of driving too fast for the road conditions.”
