**Report Any Suspicious Activity to Law Enforcement:  
Call 9-1-1.**

## Recognizing Suspicious Activity

Suspicious activity is anything that looks like it could be connected with criminal behavior—someone casing a neighborhood, forcing open a door, grabbing a child; screaming or pounding coming from a nearby residence or apartment; of strong chemical odors coming from an inappropriate building, are but a handful of examples. If the activity is or appears to be threatening to property or people, immediately report the suspicious activity by calling 9-1-1. Time is critical in apprehending criminals.

### Suspicious Vehicles


- **S**low moving vehicles, vehicles without lights, and/or the course followed appears aimless or repetitive. This is suspicious in any location, but particularly in areas of schools, parks, and playgrounds.
- **V**ehicles being loaded with valuables are suspicious if parked in front of a closed business or untended residence, even if the vehicle is a legitimate looking commercial unit - possibly even bearing a sign identifying it as a repair vehicle, moving van, etc.
- **U**nknown abandoned vehicles can also be suspicious and should be reported to law enforcement.

### Suspicious Behavior Involving Vehicles

- **P**ersons attempting forcibly to enter a locked vehicle, especially at night or in a parking lot.
- **P**ersons detaching mechanical parts or accessories from a vehicle especially at night or in a parking lot.
- **A**pparent business transactions conducted from a vehicle especially if around schools or parks, and if juveniles are involved.
- **P**ersons being forced into vehicles, especially juveniles or females.
- **O**bjects thrown from a vehicle, especially while traveling at a high speed.

### Suspicious Behavior Involving Property

- **P**roperty carried by persons on foot, especially questionable if the person is running. May be significant if the property is not wrapped as if just purchased.
- **P**roperty being removed from or being placed into vehicles or buildings if removed from closed residences whose owners are known to be absent.
- **S**omeone offers to sell you something for significantly less than the market value.
- **I**tems that accumulate in private garages, storage areas, or on property if it accumulates, especially if the items are in good condition but not in use.



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## **Suspicious Behavior Involving People**

- **S**omeone going door-to-door in a residential area if after a few houses are visited, one or more of the subjects goes into a back or side yard. It is more suspicious if one person remains in the front when this occurs.
- **S**omeone waiting in front of a house or business when the owners are absent, or if it is a business and the establishment is closed.
- **S**omeone forcing entrance to or tampering with a residence, business, vehicle, etc.
- **A** non-resident going into a back or side yard.
- **A** person running especially if something of value is being carried.


## **Other Suspicious Activity**

- **C**ontinuous “repair” operations at a non-business location.
- **O**pen or broken windows at closed businesses or residences whose owners are temporarily absent.
- **U**nusual noises such as gunshots, screaming, abnormally barking dogs, or any noise that is suggestive of foul play.
- **U**nusual smells coming from location.
- **C**ontinuous traffic that comes and goes to the same location, usually staying for very short periods of time.

## **How to Report a Crime:**

### **be prepared to provide the following information**

- **Y**our name
- **Y**our location and the phone number where you can be reached
- **A** brief description of what occurred, including the time and location
- **T**he number of suspects
- **A** physical description of the suspect(s),  
gender, race, age, height, weight, hair color/length, clothing, facial hair, tattoos/scars, clothing, etc.
- **T**he time and location that the suspect(s) were last seen
- **W**hether and what kind of weapon(s) were involved
- **A**ny other relevant details  
description of a get-away car, any distinct odors, a suspect’s accent or dialect, background noises, etc.
- **T**he location of the incident and/or a place where police can meet you to follow up



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
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
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## Vacation Security Check List

Many break-ins are crimes of opportunity. There are a number of things you can do to avoid becoming a victim while you are away from home, whether it is for a day or an extended vacation. Here are a few helpful suggestions for keeping your home and belongings safe.

- 1.** Arrange for an person you trust to check your home on a regular basis. If they are able to, encourage them to stay for various amounts of time so it appears that someone is still occupying the home.
- 2.** Double check all the windows and doors throughout the house, even if they are not easily accessible.
- 3.** Make sure exterior areas will not give your absence away. Arrange to have your mail and other deliveries stopped while you are away. If that is not possible, ask a trusted individual to collect mail, fliers or newspapers let on your porch or driveway.
- 4.** Arrange for all seasonal and weekly outdoor care to continue. If it is summer, have a lawn service or a friend upkeep your yard. In the winter, arrange for your driveways and walkways to be cleared of snow. Also arrange for trash to be put out on trash day.
- 5.** Use timers to light your home at various hours. Program a light to turn on and off at different times of the day. Timers can always be used on TVs, radios and outdoor lights.
- 6.** While it is advisable to tell a trusted neighbor, friend or local law enforcement about your absence, do not tell everyone.
- 7.** Limit postings to social media that can give away the fact that you are away from home for an extended period of time.
- 8.** Make a list of your valued possessions, include serial numbers, descriptions/engravings, price, date purchased, etc. Keep the list in a safe place outside of your home.
