FINDING OF DISQUALIFICATION

The Alaska Police Standards Council of the State of Alaska, under the authority of AS 18.65.220, and pursuant to 13 AAC 85.100(c), has provided that the Executive Director may deny an application, or find a police officer job applicant or training applicant ineligible for certification, if the applicant does not satisfy the requirements set by the council for certification. An applicant aggrieved by the decision of the executive director may petition for review of that decision by the council. The council's review of that decision is controlled by the Administrative Procedure Act.

From February 17 through May 16, 2014 Respondent attended and successfully completed the Alaska Police Standards Council approved Basic Academy at the University of Fairbanks Community and Technical College. She was not employed by a police department at that time.

On or about January 26, 2017, Respondent applied to the Sand Point Police Department for a position as a police officer. As part of their background investigation they contacted Alaska Police Standards Council and the Fairbanks Police Department for information. Fairbanks police department revealed that Respondent applied to become a police officer in Fairbanks shortly after completing the basic academy in 2014. Fairbanks conducted a background investigation at that time and found that Respondent was untruthful and previously participated in undisclosed criminal drug activity. Fairbanks Police rejected her application but did not notify the Council at that time.

Based upon the information from Fairbanks and Sand Point Police Departments the Executive Director found that these actions disqualified Respondent from certification pursuant to 13 AAC 85.100(a)(1), (b)(2)(C), and (b)(3).

On September 1, 2017, pursuant to the Administrative Procedures Act, the Executive Director notified the Respondent of his findings and of Respondent's right to petition the council for review of the decision. The notification was delivered to Respondent by certified mail, return receipt requested, on September 26, 2017. As of the date of this finding, no response has been received from Respondent.
