**ACCUSATION**

Sarah Hieb, Administrative Investigator of the Alaska Police Standards Council (APSC), State of Alaska, on behalf of the Executive Director for APSC, is seeking to revoke the Alaska police officer certificate of Respondent Daniel Gonzalez-Fawcett under the legal authority of AS 18.65.220, AS 18.65.240(c), the Council’s regulations in 13 AAC 85.110, and under the procedures governed by the Administrative Procedure Act in AS 44.62.330, et. seq. The Executive Director alleges as follows:

1. On or about July 14, 2015, the Respondent was hired by the Metlakatla Police Department as a police officer.
2. On or about November 27, 2017, Respondent was certified as a police officer by the Alaska Police Standards Council.
3. On or about December 30, 2019, Respondent resigned from Metlakatla Police Department.
4. On or about November 10, 2020, Respondent was hired by Dillingham Department of Public Safety as a police officer. He resigned from Dillingham Department of Public Safety on February 23, 2021 and was rehired by Dillingham Department of Public Safety on July 12, 2021.

5. On or about June 16, 2022, Respondent resigned from Dillingham Department of Public Safety. The Personnel Action Form (F4) submitted to APSC said Respondent had an open investigation against him at the Juneau Police Department.

6. On or about August 18, 2022, Respondent was convicted of Larceny after pleading No Contest<sup>1</sup> in Juneau Alaska. Larceny is a misdemeanor crime of dishonesty.

7. AS 18.65.240(c) provides that the APSC may deny or revoke the certificate of a police officer who does not meet the standards adopted under (a) (2) of that section.

8. 13 AAC 85.110(b)(1) provides that the council will revoke a basic, intermediate, or advanced certificate upon a finding that the holder of the certificate has been convicted of a misdemeanor crime of domestic violence or, after hire as a police officer, has been convicted of a felony, or of a misdemeanor crime listed in 13 AAC 85.010(b)(2).

9. 13 AAC 85.010(b)(2) provides that a participating police department may not hire as a police officer a person who has been convicted, during the 10 years immediately before the date of hire as a police officer, of a crime of dishonesty or crime of moral turpitude, of a crime that resulted in serious physical injury to another person, or of two or more DUI offenses, by a civilian court of this state, the United States, or another state or territory, or by a military court;
