



Juneau is Alaska's capital city, located in the "panhandle" of Southeast Alaska, approximately 500 miles southeast of Anchorage and 900 miles north of Seattle, Washington. Juneau is accessible only by air and sea, and its economy relies on government and tourism. Juneau is the traditional homeland of the Tlingit, Haida, and Tsimshian people. This rich culture is evident in the community, and there are many ways to learn, participate, and appreciate this land that we call home. Juneau also has a vibrant artistic community, welcomes diversity, and is a great place to live.

The city is served by six elementary schools, two middle schools, three high schools, a charter school, and the University of Alaska Southeast. The community has a modern hospital, a birth center, and SEARHC clinics. The city also has two museums, five libraries, theatrical groups, a symphony, baseball fields, softball fields, two indoor swimming pools, several boat harbors, an ice rink, a golf course, and a ski area. Juneau's weather is categorized as a maritime rainforest with stunning scenery and many recreational opportunities, including hunting, fishing, boating, camping, hiking, biking, kayaking, and wildlife viewing.

Juneau Police Department provides general police services to the City and Borough of Juneau, covering an area of 3,600 square miles and a population of approximately 32,000. The department has three divisions: Police Support Services, Operations and Administration. Within these divisions are eight primary units: Patrol, Investigations, Community Service, Records, Evidence, Dispatch, IT, and Administration. Due to Juneau's isolated geographic location, JPD is required to remain self-sufficient. Therefore, the department also maintains specialized teams in SWAT, Bomb Squad, and Hostage Negotiation. JPD provides regular and current training to all staff and operates from a modern facility that includes an up-to-date computerized dispatch center and records department. The City and Borough of Juneau offers excellent benefits with retirement through the State of Alaska. JPD also has a Wellness Program, focused on employee mental health, life/work balance, and overall wellbeing. JPD offers a hiring bonus to qualified Police Officer and Dispatcher applicants. Longevity bonuses are also offered every 4 years to Police Officers and continue up to year 20.
