
Accordingly, the Council has considered the Accusation dated January 11, 2016.

**ACCUSATION**

Sarah Hieb, Administrative Investigator of the Alaska Police Standards Council (APSC), State of Alaska, is seeking to revoke the police certificate of Respondent Ryan D. Webb under the legal authority of AS 18.65.240(a) and (c), the Council’s regulations in 13 AAC 85.110, and under the procedures governed by the Administrative Procedure Act in AS 44.62.330, *et. seq.* The Administrative investigator alleges as follows:

1. On or about June 4, 2007, the Respondent was hired by the Fairbanks Airport Police and Fire Department as a police officer.
2. On or about June 24, 2008, the Respondent was certified by APSC as a police officer in the State of Alaska.
3. On or about February 18, 2009, the Respondent resigned from the Fairbanks Airport Police and Fire Department. On or about February 20, 2009, the Respondent was hired by the North Pole Police Department as a police officer.
4. On or about February 23, 2011, the Respondent was terminated from the North Pole Police Department for insubordination and failure to perform (incompetence). North Pole Police Department did not recommend the Respondent's police officer certificate be revoked.

5. On or about December 4, 2014, the Respondent was criminally charged with Criminal Impersonation in the First Degree, Theft in the Second Degree, and Fraudulent use of an Access Device, all felony charges.

6. On or about November 20, 2015, the Respondent was found guilty and convicted of attempted Fraudulent Use of an Access Device, a Class A misdemeanor. The other charges in Paragraph 4 were dismissed by the prosecutor.

7. On or about January 5, 2016, North Pole Police Department submitted an amended F-4 Personnel Action Form advising of the conviction information in Paragraphs 5 and 6 and requesting the Respondent's police certificate be revoked.

8. AS 18.65.240(c) provides that the APSC may deny or revoke the certificate of a police officer who does not meet the standards adopted under (a) (2) of this section.

9. 13 AAC 85.110(b)(1) provides that the council shall revoke a basic, intermediate, or advanced certificate upon a finding that the holder of the certificate has been convicted of a misdemeanor crime listed in 13 AAC 85.010(b)(2).

### **COUNT I**

Paragraphs 1-9 are incorporated by reference. Based upon the facts described above, the Respondent has been convicted of a misdemeanor crime of moral turpitude and dishonesty, which is grounds for mandatory revocation under 13 AAC 85.110(b)(1).

14 In the interest of a prompt and speedy settlement of the above-captioned matter,  
15 consistent with the public interest, statutory requirements and the responsibilities of the  
16 Alaska Police Standards Council, and pursuant to AS 18.65.220, AS 18.65.240 and 13  
17 AAC 85.110, the undersigned parties enter into this Consent Agreement as a final  
18 disposition of this matter.

21 1. Respondent, without admitting any allegations that may have been made  
22 against him, hereby permanently relinquishes his Alaska police officer certification.

24 2. Respondent waives his right to a hearing and waives the requirement of  
25 Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law for the Decision and Order below to be  
26 effective and final;

28 3. Respondent waives any appeal or judicial review of the action agreed to  
29 herein;

31 4. Respondent and the Alaska Police Standards Council agree that this  
32 voluntary relinquishment of certification shall permanently bar Respondent from  
working as a police officer in Alaska.

5. Notwithstanding Paragraph 4, Respondent and the Alaska Police  
Standards Council agree that Respondent shall retain his right to petition the Alaska  
Police Standards Council for discretionary rescission of the revocation, as provided in  
13 AAC 85.110.


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6. Respondent understands that he has the right to consult with and be represented by an attorney concerning this Agreement and any potential Alaska Police Standards Council proceedings. Respondent agrees that this Agreement was not signed under duress and that he has had adequate time to consult with counsel or other persons of his choosing;

7. Respondent understands that the public records law and the open meetings law apply to the Alaska Police Standards Council. Nothing in this Agreement shall be interpreted to accord secrecy to the records of the Alaska Police Standards Council above and beyond that already required by law.
