FINDING OF DISQUALIFICATION

Pursuant to AS 18.65.220(6), 13 AAC 85.100, and 13 AAC 85.115 the Alaska Police Standards Council of the State of Alaska (Council), provides that the Executive Director may deny an application, or find a police officer job applicant or training applicant ineligible for police officer certification, if the applicant does not satisfy the requirements set by the council for certification. An applicant aggrieved by the decision of the Executive Director may petition for review of that decision by the council. The council's review of that decision is controlled by the Administrative Procedure Act.

In November 2018, Chance Bradford Trahan "Respondent," applied to become a Juneau Police Officer. Juneau Police conducted a criminal history background check and determined he was ineligible for hire or certification in Alaska due to prior criminal convictions. Respondent was notified of his ineligibility at that time. Nonetheless, Respondent re-applied to be a police officer with the department in January 2019.

On March 27, 2019, Respondent was arrested by Juneau Police Department on a felony warrant from Nevada charging him with Burglary. He was subsequently charged with AS 12.70.120 Fugitive from Justice and lodged in jail.

On March 28, 2019, Respondent was notified of the Executive Director's finding of disqualification, his rights under the Administrative Procedures Act, and that a failure to respond to the findings within statutory deadlines would result in a default Finding of Disqualification being entered into his record, by personal service at Lemon Creek Correctional Center.

WHEREAS, the Executive Director of the Alaska Police Standards Council has found that Respondent is disqualified from certification as a police officer in Alaska;


