- 2. That the Respondent's police officer certificate in the State of Alaska is hereby revoked; and
- 3. That this Order of Revocation shall take effect in accordance with AS 44.62.520(a).

## **ACCUSATION**

Terry Vrabec, Director of the Police Standards Council (APSC), Department of Public Safety of the State of Alaska, is seeking to revoke the police certificate of Respondent Clint R. Songer under the legal authority of AS 18.65.240(a) and (c), the Council's regulations in 13 AAC 85.110, and under the procedures governed by the Administrative Procedure Act in AS 44.62.330, *et. seq.* The administrator alleges as follows:

- 1. On or about August 25, 2000, the Respondent was hired by the Alaska State Troopers as a State Trooper.
- 2. On or about August 25, 2001, the Respondent submitted an application to the Alaska Police Standards Council (APSC) for a police officer certificate, and was certified by APSC as a police officer in the state of Alaska.
- 3. On or about August 6, 2006, the Respondent was charged with 2 counts of domestic assault in the 4<sup>th</sup> degree in the District Court for the State of Alaska in Cordova.
- 4. On August 20, 2007, the Respondent pled no contest to the charge of harassment in the District Court for the State of Alaska in Cordova. That criminal complaint charged that Clinton R. Songer with intent to harass or annoy another person, subjected another person to offensive physical contact.

- 7. On May 1, 2008, the Respondent was arrested with driving under the influence of alcohol and misconduct involving weapons in the 4<sup>th</sup> degree. The complaint filed in the District Court for the State of Alaska in Juneau charged that he drove with a blood alcohol content of .211%.
- 8. On August 19, 2008, the Respondent pled guilty to the crime of driving under the influence. He was sentenced to serve 5 days in custody, to pay a \$1,500.00 fine, and placed on several other conditions of court probation. This conviction was in violation of the probation conditions set by the District Court in Cordova in the previous harassment case.
- 9. The Respondent resigned from Alaska State Troopers in lieu of termination on June 27, 2008.
- 10. AS 18.65.240(c) provides that the APSC "may deny or revoke the certificate of a police officer who does not meet the standards adopted under (a)(2) of this section."
- 11. AS 18.65.240(a)(2) requires that a police officer "possess[es] other qualifications the council has established for the employment of police officers, including . . . citizenship, moral character, and experience. . ."
- 12. 13 AAC 85.010(a)(3) requires that a police officer be of good moral character.

13. 13 AAC 85.110(a)(3) provides that the council will, in its discretion, revoke the certificate of a police officer who does not meet the standards for a police officer set forth in 13 AAC 85.010.

14. 13 AAC 85.110(a)(2) provides that the council will, in its discretion revoke the certificate of an officer who has been discharged or resigned under threat of discharge from employment as a police officer for cause other than dishonesty or misconduct.

## **COUNT I**

Paragraphs 1 through 14 are incorporated by reference. The Respondent does not meet the minimum standards for certified police officer established under 13 AAC 85. 010(a)(3) because he lacks good moral character, which is grounds for discretionary revocation under 13 AAC 85.110(a)(3).

## COUNT II

Paragraphs 1 through 14 are incorporated by reference. The Respondent was discharged or resigned under threat of discharge from employment as a police officer for cause other than dishonesty or misconduct, which is grounds for discretionary revocation under 13 AAC 85.110(a)(3).

WHEREFORE the administrator prays that Clint R. Songer's certificate as a police officer in the State of Alaska be revoked.
