## DENIAL OF APPLICATION FOR

## POLICE OFFICER CERTIFICATION

Jack W. Wray, Administrator of the Alaska Police Standards Council, Department of Public Safety of the State of Alaska, under authority of AS 18.65.220(5), denies the application by Robert H. Harper for certification as a police officer pursuant to AS 18.65.220(1)-(2), AS 18.65.240(a)(2), AS 18.65.240(c), AS 18.65.270, AS 44.62.330 <u>et seq</u>., 13 AAC 85.010(a)(3), 13 AAC 85.040(b)(2), 13 AAC 85.100(a)(2), 13 AAC 85.100(a)(3), and 13 AAC 85.900(7)(D).

The Administrator finds that:

 On or about September 8, 1980, the applicant was hired as a part-time police officer by the North Police Police Department.

2. On or about February 4, 1981, the applicant was promoted to a full-time police officer position with the North Pole Police Department.

3. On or about January 15, 1982, the applicant submitted an application to the Alaska Police Standards Council for a police officer certificate.

4. On or about February 23, 1982, the applicant was certified as a police officer in the State of Alaska.

5. On or about March 21, 1984, the applicant was discharged for cause from employment as a police officer for the North Pole Police Department. The reason cited was "numerous deficiencies in job performance."

6. On or about March 21, 1985, the applicant's certificate as a police officer in the State of Alaska lapsed.

7. On or about September 16, 1986, the applicant was hired as an Airport Safety Officer for the Fairbanks International Airport police department.

8. In November of 1987, the Fairbanks City Police contacted the Chief of Airport Security officers for the Fairbanks International Airport about an incident involving the applicant's abuse of alcohol.

9. On or about June 15, 1988, the applicant was arrested by the Alaska State Troopers and charged with driving while intoxicated. On or about September 19, 1988, the applicant was convicted of this offense.

10. On or about August 11, 1988, the applicant resigned his employment, effective September 15, 1988, as an Airport Safety Officer for the Fairbanks International Airport police department.

11. On or about August 14, 1988, the applicant submitted a written request to withdraw his notice of resignation.

12. On or about August 17, 1988, Airport Manager Chris Birch denied the applicant's request to withdraw his resignation.

On or about September 9, 1988, Airport Manager Chris 13. Birch notified the applicant that an Administrative had the applicant's Investigation revealed continued alcohol-related behavior pattern, continued violation of and continued off-duty conduct which S.O.P. 400.5(a) discredited the mission of the Airport Safety Officer. Further, that, in view of the applicant's August 11, 1988, notice of resignation, termination of employment action was being deferred to allow the September 15, 1988, resignation to take effect.

14. Thereafter, the applicant grieved the denial of his request to withdraw his resignation. On or about July 15, 1989, the arbitrator assigned to hear the case sustained the applicant's grievance and ordered that the applicant be reinstated by his employer.

15. On or about May 21, 1990, the applicant submitted an Application for Certification as a police officer to the Alaska Police Standards Council.

16. On or about September 18, 1990, the APSC received a copy of the applicant's application file from the Fairbanks Police Department, consisting of a Polygraph Examination Report dated March 2, 1981, and a supplemental investigation report prepared by Detective Nielsen on March 3, 1981.

17. Detective Nielsen's report of the polygraph examination indicates that the applicant admitted writing checks without sufficient funds, committing thefts from employers, committing a theft from a crime scene while employed as a police officer, and receiving stolen property.

18. On June 10, 1991, the APSC received a report from David J. Sperbeck, Ph.D., a clinical psychologist who examined applicant in May of 1991. In his summary of test results, the Sperbeck stated that the applicant Dr. Dr. Sperbeck concluded that, unless the applicant discontinued consuming alcohol and began participating in the AA program "wholeheartedly," then it was his opinion that the will only worsen and that his alcoholism my eventually jeopardize his ability to safely carry out his duties" as an officer.

19. On or about July 15, 1991, the applicant was arrested by the Alaska State Troopers and charged with driving while intoxicated. The applicant advised the troopers that he had consumed approximately eight beers prior to driving his motor vehicle.

The Administrator has determined that:

20. Based on the above findings, and particularly finding number 5, there are adequate grounds to deny the application because the applicant was discharged, for cause, from employment as a police officer, contrary to 13 AAC 85.100(a)(2). This determination constitutes a sufficient basis, in and of itself, to deny the application.

21. Based on the above findings, and in particular finding number 13, there are adequate grounds to deny certification because the applicant was permitted to resign

under threat of discharge, for cause, from employment as a police officer, contrary to 13 AAC 85.100(a)(2). This determination constitutes a sufficient basis, in and of itself, to deny the application.

22. Based on the above findings, and in particular finding numbers 8, 9, 17, 18 and 19, there are adequate grounds to deny certification because the applicant lacks good moral character, contrary to 13 AAC 85.010(a)(3) and 13 AAC 85.900(7)(D). This determination constitutes a sufficient basis, in and of itself, to deny the application.

Wherefore, the Administrator denies police officer certification to Mr. Robert H. Harper.
