Troopers Halfway Through Holiday High Visibility Enforcement Efforts

State, Wildlife Troopers out in force over holiday season; Alaskans reminded to drive sober, safely

From 12/13/2018 thru 12/26/2018, Troopers made the following contacts:

- 18 misdemeanor DUI arrests, 0 felony DUI Arrests
- 5 drivers charged with driving with a suspended or revoked license
- 37 REDDIs reported with 9 drivers contacted and ultimately determined not to be DUI
- 137 damage only crashes 13 injury crashes and 2 fatal collisions were investigated by troopers
- Of the 428 citations issued, 148 were issued for speeding and 7 issued for seatbelt or other occupant restraint violations

December 13, 2018 ANCHORAGE, Alaska – The snow is falling, lights are brightening up neighborhoods and holiday parties are in full swing! For those of you that have to traverse our highways to get to and from your holly jolly good time, we would like to encourage you to make a plan to get home safely. To help remind you to not drive impaired, the Alaska State Troopers and Alaska Wildlife Troopers will be conducting a high visibility enforcement effort, starting today and running into the early morning hours of Jan. 1 of the new year.

The Department of Public Safety recognizes that alcohol is a part of many festivities this time of year. If you plan on partaking, don't drive. Please have a plan in place to not drive impaired. The Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over Campaign is done annually around the holidays to encourage the motoring public to keep safety in mind and to prevent this time of year from turning tragic.

The focused enforcement by the Alaska State Troopers and Alaska Wildlife Troopers over the holiday is intended to prevent major injury and fatality crashes through enhanced enforcement. While the troopers are out to curb DUIs, they will also be on the lookout for additional driver behaviors that often contribute to fatal crashes, such as speeding and driving too fast for conditions.
