Course Details and Equipment Requirements

Course Overview

Course Duration: 3 Days

An in-depth look into weapon and equipment manipulations, human anatomy, principles of light employment and movement will occur both on the range and in the classroom. Low light myths and status quos will be challenged as the class explore the reality of critical engagements through force on force. Drills will incorporate threat identification, adverse shooting platforms and NLTA.

Low Light Firearms courses can range from an 4-hour, 8-hour, or multi-day course incorporating live fire, interior work and NLTA drills.

Required Equipment
