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CRIME IN ALASKA

The major source of data used to measure the trend and distribution of crime in Alaska is the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program. Under this program, statistics are compiled by law enforcement agencies as crimes are reported. Seven offense categories, selected because they represent the most common local problems, have been defined as Crime Index Offenses. They are serious both because of their nature and the frequency with which they occur. The offenses of murder, forcible rape, robbery and aggravated assault make up the violent crimes. The offenses of burglary, larceny-theft and motor vehicle theft make up the property crimes.

The UCR Program was established in 1930 by the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) when the need was recognized for crime statistics through which they could gain a basic understanding of the nature and scope of the nation's crime problem. The FBI took over the responsibility of receiving, tabulating and publishing the crime statistics which are voluntarily submitted by police agencies.

The statistics are issued annually during August by the FBI in the publication, Crime in the United States. The statistics for Alaska are compiled by the research unit of the Criminal Justice Planning Agency and are presented to the Governor's Commission for the Administration of Justice preceding national publication.

Several problems exist within the UCR Program which bring it under criticism. One of these criticisms is that the population bases which are used in computing the crime rates are sometimes only estimates. This is especially true in non-census years. Also, crime may be either undiscovered and therefore unreported or, as recent victimization surveys have indicated, unreported even though discovered.


Despite these problems, UCR statistics do represent the basis for public awareness of crime and are the major source for a statistical understanding of the national crime problem. It is more reasonable to improve the existing program than to scrap it in favor of a new collection system which might, in the end, prove to be more fallible.

CRIME INDEX RATE


One of the basic measurements used in crime statistics is the crime index rate. This rate is defined as the number of incidents per 100,000 inhabitants. Since it relates the incidence of crime to the total population, it provides a means of comparing current and historical data for the State of Alaska and also allows us to compare our rates with nationwide data.

During 1978, the Crime Index rate for Alaska was 5714.5 per 100,000 persons. This represents a two percent decrease from the 5,819.7 rate for 1977. During 1978 there was an increase in the number of police departments submitting crime statistics to the Criminal Justice Planning Agency. The new participants are Hoonah, Nome, North Pole, Seward, Cordova, North Slope Borough and Whittier. When the number of crimes reported by these police departments are included, the Crime Index rate is 6075.9 or 4% greater than during 1977.

Figure 1 indicates the trend of Alaska's Crime Index from 1973 to 1979 and compares it to the 1973-1977 nationwide rates.



There is a widely held theory that crime ran rampant in Alaska while the Trans-Alaska pipeline was being built. Our previous analyses have shown that the crime did not increase in proportion to the population increase; this year, however, there was a substantial decrease in the number of crimes reported. Since 1973, the population of Alaska has increased by twenty-seven percent and the number of crimes reported by forty-seven percent. The crime rate, however, has only increased sixteen percent. This means that the large increase in the state's population was not accompanied by a comparable increase in the crime rate.



This analysis can be expanded by discussing changes in the violent and property crime rates. Murder, rape, robbery and aggravated assault are defined as violent crimes. Burglary, larceny/theft and motor vehicle theft are defined as property crimes.

Figures 3 and 4 illustrate the trend of violent and property crimes from 1973 to 1978. The percentage changes in the number of offenses reported and the crime rates are shown. The violent crime rate has increased by seven percent since 1973. During 1977 and 1978 however, there has been a downward trend in this rate. The property crime rate has also started to decrease and shows only a sixteen percent increase since 1973.





Table 1 shows a detailed breakdown of the reported offenses and crime index rates for 1973-1978. The statistics are broken down into the categories of violent, property, murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny/theft and motor vehicle theft.

In order to determine the trend of crime in Alaska, the crime index rates for 1973-1978 were used to make a straight-line projection for 1979. This projection shows that the total crime index is predicted to increase by four percent to 5,957.7 offenses per 100,000 persons. All of the crimes show predicted increases with the exception of murder which shows a decrease of twelve percent.

ALASKAN VS. NATIONAL CRIME RATES

Table 3 presents a comparison of Alaska's 1977 crime rates with the rates of a state of similar size, the geographic division and the entire United States.

The State of Wyoming was selected because its population is comparable to Alaska's. Wyoming has the smallest population within the U.S. and Alaska the next smallest. It was found that Alaska's crime rate was forty-two percent greater than Wyoming's rate of 4,106.7 per 100,000 persons.

Alaska is one of the states included in the Pacific Geographic Division. The remaining states are California, Hawaii, Oregon and Washington. When these rates are compared to Alaska's, it is found that Alaska's crime index rate was fourteen percent lower than that of the division. The violent crime rate was twenty-eight percent lower and the property crime rate was fourteen percent lower.

When Alaska's rates were compared to those of the entire U.S., it was found that Alaska's total crime index rate was fifteen percent greater. The violent crime rate was three percent lower and the property crime rate was seventeen percent greater.

CRIME ANALYSIS OF ALASKA'S URBAN CITIES

Reported Offenses

Throughout the remainder of this report, the statistics for the Anchorage, Fairbanks, Juneau and Ketchikan police departments will be presented along with the statewide totals. The statistics for the respective Alaska State Trooper detachments have not been included since they are compiled at the broad detachment level and cannot be broken down further.

Table 5 presents the contribution of each city to the crime index offenses which were reported from 1975 - 1978. The statistics are broken down into the categories of total, violent and property crimes. The contribution of each city has remained relatively constant during this period. Detailed analysis for the state, each city and the rest of the state can be found in Tables 6 through 11.

Crime Rates and Trends

The 1975 - 1978 crime rates for Anchorage, Fairbanks, Juneau and Ketchikan are presented in Tables 12 through 15. The predicted rates for 1979 and the predicted percentage change between 1978 and 1979 are also presented.

Fairbanks has the greatest predicted change with minus forty-nine percent. Ketchikan is second with minus five percent. Both Juneau and Anchorage show predicted increases of three percent and one percent, respectively. Projected changes are also shown for each crime index offense, violent crimes and property crimes.

Tables 16 to 19 present comparisons of the crime rates for Anchorage, Fairbanks, Juneau and Ketchikan with other United States cities of similar sizes. These tables indicate that the crime rates for Alaskan cities are much greater than those of other U.S. cities. The rate for Anchorage is thirty-one percent greater than that of comparable cities in the lower 48, Fairbanks twenty-three percent greater, Juneau one hundred percent greater, and Ketchikan two hundred forty-four percent greater. Anchorage, Fairbanks and Juneau showed improvement over 1977 when the same comparisons showed differences of ninety-three percent, seventy-six percent, one-hundred forty-eight percent and one-hundred seventy-three percent, respectively.

In order to compare the crime profiles of Anchorage, Fairbanks, Juneau and Ketchikan, Tables 20 through 21 have been prepared. The tables present rankings by the number of reported offenses, the 1978 crime rates and the change in crime rates between 1977 and 1978.

Ranking by Number of Reported Offenses

Anchorage was first and Fairbanks second in all of the rankings by number of reported offenses. For the total crime index offenses reported, Ketchikan was ranked third and Juneau fourth.

Ranking by Crime Rate

Ketchikan was first and Anchorage second in the ranking by total crime index rate. Juneau was third and Fairbanks fourth.

Ranking by Crime Rate Change

Ketchikan had the greatest increase in crime rate between 1977 and 1978. Juneau remained the same and Anchorage and Fairbanks showed decreases for the same time period.

CRIMINAL HOMICIDE

DEFINITION: This crime index offense is defined as the willful killing of another. As a general rule, any death due to a fight, argument, quarrel, assault, or commission of a crime is included. Suicides, accidental deaths, assaults to murder and attempted murders are not included.

VOLUME: In 1978, there were fifty-six murders reported in Alaska. Two of these murders were reported in cities new to the UCR program. Murders represented three percent of the total violent crime and less than one percent of the total crime index offenses. Table 22 shows that the number of reported offenses increased fifteen percent over 1977. The incidence of murder increased in all of the state's major urban areas.



TREND: In 1978, there were 12.9 murders for every 100,000 Alaskans. This is an increase of eighteen percent over the 10.9 rate for 1977. Figure 5 indicates a predicted rate of 11.3 for 1979 which is a decrease of twelve percent.

NATURE OF MURDER: Of the fifty-six murders reported to law enforcement agencies, fifty-one were verified and determined to be actual offenses. Seventy-three percent of the murder victims were male and twenty-seven percent female. Fifty-nine percent were white, ten percent black, eighteen percent Indian and thirteen percent all other races. The largest number of victims (37%) were in the 18 to 29 age group.

During 1978, firearms were used in sixty-five percent of the murders and knives in nineteen percent. The firearms category includes handguns (53%) and rifles (12%). Hands, fist and feet, blunt objects, and exposure were the weapons in the remainder of the offenses.

Thirty-three percent occurred during family or lover's quarrels, ten percent while a robbery was being committed and fourteen percent during arguments or street fights. The circumstances were unknown in nineteen percent of the murders.

In nine percent of the murders, the offender was not identified. Of those identified, eighty-three percent were male and seventeen were female. Fifty-one percent of the offenders fell into the 18 - 29 age group. Also, five of the offenders (10%) committed suicide after the murder.



CLEARANCE RATE: During 1978, eighty-two percent of the actual reported murders were cleared by arrest. Six percent were cleared by juvenile arrests.

PERSONS ARRESTED: Of those arrested for murder, eighty-six percent were male and fourteen percent female. Eleven percent were under the age of 18, forty percent between the ages of 18 and 24 and forty-nine percent 25 and older. Fifty-five percent of the persons arrested were white, twenty-three percent black, eleven percent Indian and eleven percent all other races.

FORCIBLE RAPE

DEFINITION: Forcible rape is defined as the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. Actual rapes, assaults to rape and attempts to rape are included. Statutory rape is not included.


VOLUME: In 1978, there were 276 forcible rapes reported in Alaska. 22 of these rapes were reported in cities new to the UCR program. Rapes represented 15 percent of the total violent crime and 1 percent of the total crime index offenses. Table 28 shows that the number of reported rapes decreased slightly from 1977 in cities which reported during both years.

TREND: In 1978, there were 60.5 rapes for every 100,000 Alaskans. This is an increase of two percent over the 59.3 rate for 1977. Figure 7 indicates a predicted rate of 63.0 for 1979 which is an increase of four percent.



NATURE OF FORCIBLE RAPE: During 1978, seventy-one percent of all forcible rapes were actual rapes by force. The remainder were attempts and assaults to commit forcible rape. Twenty percent of the offenses reported to the police were determined to be unfounded. The overall unfounded rate for the total crime index offenses was five percent.

Figure 8 presents the distribution of actual and attempted forcible rapes.



CLEARANCE RATE: During 1978, thirty-five percent of the actual reported rapes were cleared by arrests. Two percent were cleared by juvenile arrests.

PERSONS ARRESTED: All the persons arrested for rape were males. Eight percent were under the age of 18, thirty-six were between the ages of 18 and 24, and fifty-six percent were 25 and older. Thirty-four percent of the persons arrested were white, twelve percent black, fifteen percent Indian, and thirty-nine percent all other races.

REPORTED OFFENSES: The following figure indicates the month in which the rapes were reported.



ROBBERY

DEFINITION: Robbery is defined as taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person by force, threat of force, violence, or by putting the victim in fear. It is a vicious type of theft that takes place in the presence of the victim. The victim is directly confronted and threatened with force or the fear that force will be used.

VOLUME: During 1978, there were 389 robberies reported in Alaska. 10 of these robberies were reported in cities new to the UCR program. Robberies represented twenty-two percent of the total violent crimes and two percent of the total crime index offenses. Table 30 shows the number of reported robberies decreased nine percent during 1978 in cities which reported during both years.



NATURE OF ROBBERY: Forty-four percent of the robberies occurred within businesses and twenty percent occurred on streets and alleys. In Anchorage, the largest percentage of robberies occurred in businesses, however, in Fairbanks, Juneau and Ketchikan, they occurred on streets and alleys.




Figure II presents an analysis of the weapons used during the commission of robberies. The majority of the offenses involved firearms and strong-arm tactics



CLEARANCE RATES: In 1978, seventeen percent of the actual reported robberies were cleared by an arrest. Three percent were cleared by the arrest of juveniles.

PERSONS ARRESTED: Of the persons arrested for robbery, ninety-three percent were males and seven percent females. Twenty-seven percent were under the age of 18, fifty-six percent between the ages of 18 and 24 and seventeen percent were 25 and older. Seventy-six percent of the persons arrested were white, nine percent black, ten percent Indian, and five percent all other races.

REPORTED OFFENSES: The following figure shows the month in which the robberies were reported.



AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

DEFINITION: Aggravated assault is defined as an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe bodily injury. It is usually accompanied by the use of a weapon or other means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. Attempts are included since serious personal injury would probably result if the crime was successfully completed. Simple assaults are not included.

VOLUME: During 1978, there were 1,218 aggravated assaults reported. 176 of these assaults were reported in cities new to the UCR program. Aggravated assaults represented sixty percent of the total violent crime and four percent of the total crime index offenses. Table 33 shows that the number of reported aggravated assaults decreased by fifteen percent during 1978 in cities which reported during both years.



TREND: In 1978, there were 243.1 aggravated assaults per 100,000 Alaskans. This is a decrease of thirteen percent from the 286.5 rate for 1977. Figure 13 indicates a predicted rate of 251.8 for 1979, which is an increase of one percent.

NATURE OF AGGRAVATED ASSAULTS: During 1978, thirty-three percent of the aggravated assaults involved firearms, thirty-two percent involved hands, fists or feet, and nineteen percent knives. In Anchorage, firearms were involved in a large portion of the aggravated assaults. Hands, fists or feet were involved in Fairbanks, Ketchikan and the smaller cities. The use of knives increased in Juneau, but hands, fists and feet still accounted for a large percentage.



ANALYSIS OF AGGRAVATED ASSAULT BY WEAPON USED - 1978



CLEARANCE RATE: In 1978, sixty-six percent of the actual reported aggravated assaults were cleared by an arrest. Seven percent of the offenses were cleared by the arrest of a juvenile.

PERSONS ARRESTED: Of the persons arrested for aggravated assault, ninety percent were males and ten percent were females. Ten percent were under the age of 18, thirty-five percent between the ages of 18 and 24, and fifty-five percent were 25 and older. Fifty-two percent of the persons arrested were white, six percent were black, twenty percent Indian, and twenty-two percent all other races.

OFFENSES REPORTED: Figure 15 indicates the months in which the aggravated assaults were reported.



BURGLARY

DEFINITION: Burglary is defined as the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or theft. This includes entry involving force of any kind, entry using no force, and attempted entry involving force of any kind.

VOLUME: During 1978, there were 5,659 burglaries reported in Alaska. 329 of these burglaries were reported in cities new to the UCR program. Burglaries represented twenty-four percent of the total property crime and twenty-two percent of the total crime index offenses. Table 35 shows that the number of reported burglaries decreased five percent from 1977 in cities which reported during both years.



BY TIME OF DAY - 1978




LARCENY-THEFT

DEFINITION: Larceny-theft is defined as the unlawful taking of property without the use of force, violence, or fraud. It includes crimes such as shoplifting, pocket-picking, purse snatching, theft of motor vehicle parts, and bicycle theft.

VOLUME: In 1978, there were 14,903 larceny-thefts reported in Alaska. 691 of these larcenies were reported in cities new to the UCR program. Larcenies represented sixty-four percent of the total property crime and fifty-nine percent of the total crime index offenses. Table 39 shows that the number of reported larcenies increased by one percent from 1977 in cities which reported during both years.



NATURE OF LARCENY-THEFT: During 1978, the majority of the larceny-thefts were from buildings (23%), shoplifting (19%) and from motor vehicles (18%). The average value of the property stolen was \$291 with total losses of \$4,214,599. Thefts from buildings had the greatest loss per offense with \$371 and shoplifting had the lowest with \$30.



PERSONS ARRESTED: Of the persons arrested for larceny-theft 73 percent were males and 27 percent females. Fifty-seven percent were under the age of 18, twenty-four percent between the ages of 18 and 24 and nineteen percent were 25 or older. MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

DEFINITION: Motor vehicle theft is defined as the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle.

VOLUME: In 1978, there were 3,018 motor vehicle thefts reported in Alaska. 288 of these thefts were reported in cities new to the UCR program. Motor vehicle thefts represented twelve percent of the total property crime and twelve percent of the total crime index offenses. Table 42 shows that the number of reported motor vehicle thefts decreased twenty percent from 1977 in cities which reported during both years.



NATURE OF MOTOR VEHICLE THEFTS: During 1978, forty-five percent of the motor vehicles stolen were automobiles, twenty-five percent trucks or buses and thirty percent other vehicles such as snowmobiles and motorcycles. 



PROPERTY STOLEN AND RECOVERED

Table 44 presents the value of the property which was stolen while Crime Index Offenses were being committed. It also shows the value of the goods which were recovered. Stolen motor vehicles accounted for forty-one percent of the total value stolen. This category was followed by miscellaneous goods (24%), jewelry/precious metals (14%), currency/ notes (8%) and T.V., Radios, cameras (7%).

An analysis of the value of the property recovered shows that stolen motor vehicles had the greatest recovery rate with seventy-eight percent. This was followed by jewelry/ precious metals (49%), livestock (33%), consumable goods (18%), firearms (17%), and clothing/furs (16%).

Overall, \$15,025,728 worth of goods were stolen. \$6,989,456 of these goods (47%) were recovered.

PART II CRIMES

As in 1976 & 1977, the Alaska State Troopers and Juneau Police Department collected and submitted data about reported Part II crimes. Next year, the number of agencies collecting this data will be greatly expanded by the implementation of Alaska's incident-based UCR system.

Table 45 presents an analysis of the Part I and Part II crimes reported to the State Troopers during 1975 - 1978. During 1978, Part I crimes accounted for fifty-six percent of the reported crimes and Part II crimes for forty-four percent.

Those offenses which account for the majority of the Part II crimes are Driving While Intoxicated (11%), Vandalism (9%), Other Offenses (7%), Other Assaults (5%), Narcotic Drug Violations (3%), Embezzlement & Fraud (2%) and Possession of Weapons (2%).

The offense which accounted for a larger proportionate share of the number of crimes reported during 1977 was Narcotic Drug Violations (+1%). Driving While Intoxicated showed a decrease of one percent. All other offenses stayed at approximately the same rate of contribution.

Table 46 presents the distribution of the offenses reported to the Juneau Police Department. Part I crimes accounted for twenty-five percent and Part II crimes for seventy-five percent. This is similar to the distribution of crimes during 1977.

During 1978, those offenses which accounted for the largest proportions were Disorderly Conduct (23%), Other Offenses (17%), Vandalism (9%), Liquor Laws (8%), and Other Assaults (6%).

Those offenses which showed increases were Other Offenses (+5%) and Embezzlement/Fraud (+1%). Disorderly Conduct (-6%), Other Assaults (-2%) and Liquor Laws (-1%) showed decreases.

PART I OFFENSES


During 1978, twenty-three percent of the actual reported Part I Crimes were cleared by arrest. The rates for violent property and individual Part I crimes, however, provide better indicators of which crimes are being cleared.

Violent crimes had a fifty-three percent clearance rate, while property crime had a twenty-one percent rate. Police are able to clear a higher percent of violent crimes because witnesses are usually available to identify offenders and these crimes receive more intensive investigative efforts.

Figure 24 presents a graphic description of the clearance rates for 1978 and compares them to the 1977 rates. Proportionately more murders, rapes, aggravated assaults, larceny/thefts and motor vehicle thefts were cleared during 1978. Only robberies and burglaries showed decreases in their clearance rates. Table 47 presents a more detailed analysis.

CLEARANCE RATES

PART II OFFENSES

During 1978, the Alaska State Troopers and the Juneau Police Department collected the data necessary to compute the clearance rates for Part II offenses.

Table 48 shows that the Troopers made arrests in 72% of the actual Part II crimes which were reported to them. Those offenses with the highest rates were Vagrancy (100%), Gambling (100%), Driving While Intoxicated (99%), Drunkenness & Disorderly Conduct (96%), Narcotic Drug Violations (87%), Liquor Laws (87%) and Stolen Property (81%). Those offenses with the lowest rates were Vandalism (17%) and Arson (21%).

DRUG AND ALCOHOL RELATED ARRESTS

Alcohol and drug-related crimes comprised 48% of the Statewide arrests for 1978. Drug abuse violations accounted for 4% and alcohol-related crimes for 44%.

Table 71 shows that drug abuse arrests have represented approximately the same proportion of total arrests since 1976. Alcohol-related crimes represent approximately 4% more of the total arrests than during 1976. The increases are reflected in the Liquor Laws arrests (+3%), Drunkenness (+2%). Driving Under the Influence (-1%) decreased by 1%.

Adult arrests for both Sale/Manufacturing and Possession of drugs decreased during 1978.

Within the Sale/Manufacturing category, there were decreases for Opium, Cocaine or their derivatives (-20%) and Marijuana (-6%). Synthetic Narcotics and Other Dangerous non-narcotic drugs increased by 50% and 33%, respectively.

Adult arrests for Possession decreased for Opium, Cocaine or their derivatives (-9%), Marijuana (-1%) and Other Dangerous Non-Narcotic drugs (-81%). Arrests for possession of Synthetic Narcotics increased by 100%.

Juvenile arrests for Sale/Manufacturing decreased by 21% while those for Possession increased by 35%.

Large decreases occurred in each of the Sale/Manufacturing drug arrest classifications. They ranged from -400% (Synthetic Narcotics) to -7% (Marijuana).

Juvenile arrests for drug possession decreased in the Synthetic Narcotics classification by 60%. All other classes increased: Opium, Cocaine or their derivatives (+25%), Marijuana (+36%) and Other Dangerous Non-Narcotic Drugs (+56%).

Law Enforcement Officers Killed or Assaulted

During 1978, 212 law enforcement officers were assaulted in Alaska --- an increase of 13% over 1977. 74(35%) of these assaults occurred when officers responded to disturbance calls. 32(15%) occurred while officers were attempting other arrests. Of the officers assaulted 95(45%) sustained personal injury.

31(15%) of the assaults took place between 12:01-2:00 a.m., 25(12%) between 2:00-4:00 a.m., 23(11%) between 4:00-6:00 a.m., 27(13%) between 6:00-8:00 p.m., and 40(19%) between 10:00-12:00 a.m.

151(71%) of the assaults occurred while the officer was in a one-man vehicle. 42(20%) occurred while the officer was in a two-man vehicle.
