Dear Lt. Dunnagan,

In response to your letter of April 20, 2001, and pursuant to Title 21, Section 1290.26 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the State of Oklahoma hereby grants reciprocity to the citizens of the State of Alaska who hold valid concealed weapons permits from that state. Any person entering this state in possession of a firearm authorized by Alaska for concealed carry is authorized to continue to carry a concealed firearm in Oklahoma; provided the firearm remains fully concealed from detection and view, and that upon coming in contact with any peace officer of this state, the person discloses the fact that he or she is in possession of a concealed firearm pursuant to a valid concealed carry weapons permit issued from your state.

I will notify you of any change in Oklahoma law which might call into doubt the appropriateness of reciprocity between our states. Please notify me of any changes in your law. If I may be of any further help to you, please do not hesitate to contact me.
