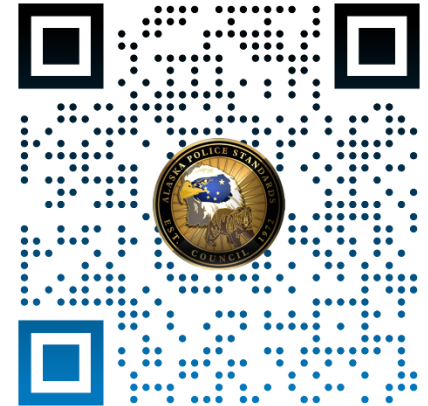

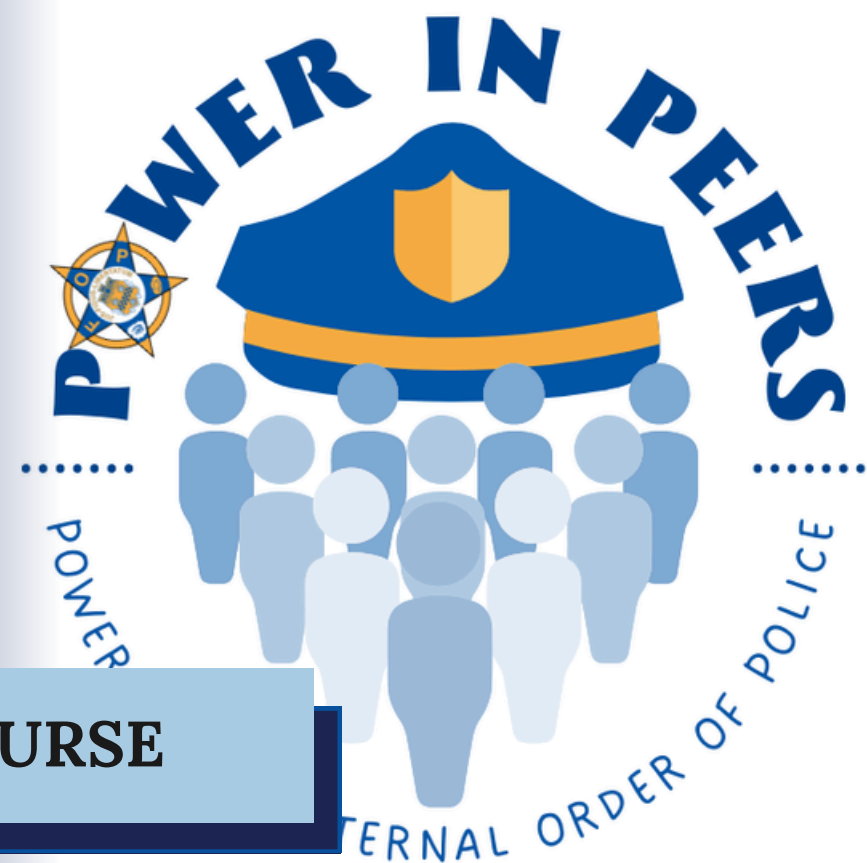

# Strangulation: Response, Investigation, & Prosecution

**Virtual Training**  
**May 11 and 12, 2026**  
**8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. (daily)**

Non-fatal strangulation has been identified as a key indicator for risk of lethality in domestic violence cases. This advanced course offers an in-depth and multidisciplinary approach to these types of assaults. This course is designed for law enforcement, prosecution professionals, and forensic medical professionals.

The following individuals are eligible to apply\*:

**CDVSA funded victim service providers, Alaskan forensic medical providers, Department of Law prosecutors and paralegals, DPS Navigators, APSC Certified Municipal Officers, Alaska State Troopers, and VPSOs.**

## The core objectives of this advanced two day course:

- ◆ Identify key factors in the lethality of strangulation;
- ◆ Describe the anatomy, physiology, and signs and symptoms of strangulation in surviving and non-surviving cases;
- ◆ Improve documentation of strangulation cases in the context of intimate partner violence, sexual assault, and child abuse;
- ◆ Discuss best-practices in trauma-informed advocacy, interviewing, prosecution, and/or patient/case management and;
- ◆ Develop local experts to use in trial.

## Active Shooter Response Level 1 – Train-the-Trainer

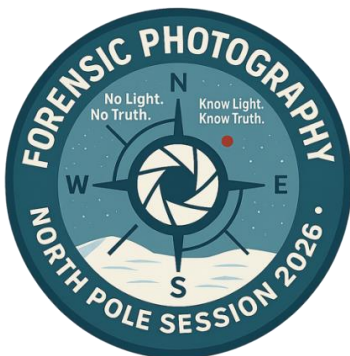

The Anchorage Police Department Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) is an innovative police-based first responder program that is based on the "Memphis model" of pre-arrest jail diversion for those experiencing a crisis. The CIT program is a community partnership of law enforcement, mental health and addiction professionals, individuals who live with mental illness and/or addiction disorders, their families, and other partners to improve community responses to mental health crises. While CIT programs are known for CIT-trained officers, successful programs also focus on improving the crisis response system, advocating for needed services, and strengthening partnerships across the community.

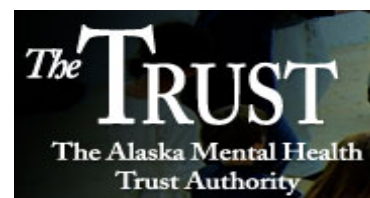
National outcomes have shown CIT to be effective in developing empathy, positive perceptions, and increased confidence among first responders; providing efficient crisis response times; increasing jail diversion among those with mental illness; improving the likelihood of treatment continuity with community-based providers; and impacting psychiatric symptomatology for those living with a serious mental illness as well as substance abuse disorders. This was all accomplished while significantly decreasing police officer and citizen injury rates.

The target audience for APD CIT is first responder personnel, which includes, but is not limited to police officers, dispatchers, report takers, Fire and EMS, police and fire chaplains, child and adult case workers, adult and juvenile probation officers, DOC employees, United States Military, mental health case or social workers, school personnel, hospital staff, and mental health service providers.
